(ADDITIONAL DUTIES) ORDER, 19

The Governor in Council in exercise of the powers conferred on him by section 3 of the Emergency Powers (Disasters) Act makes the following Order:

| Citation. | 1. This Order may be cited as the Emergency Powers (Disasters) (Additional Duties) Order, 19 . |
| Power of Governor in Council. | 2. Notwithstanding anything contained in an Enactment prescribing the duties of a public Officer, the Governor in Council may call upon a Public officer to perform such other duties as it Considers necessary in addition to or in place Of the duties imposed on the public officer by Virtue of an enactment. |
| Additional duties by public officers. | 3. A Head of Department may call upon a public officer or public employee of that Department to perform or execute any additional work or duty that, in the opinion of the Head of Department, is necessary or expedient for the securing of the safety of the public or for the maintenance of supplies and essential services. |
| Additional duties by Statutory Board employees | 4. A Statutory Board may call on an employee in its service to perform and execute any additional work or duty that in the opinion of the Board, is necessary or expedient for the securing of the public safety, or for the maintenance of supply and essential services. |
| Additional duties by scheduled employers. Schedule | 5. The owner, manager or person in charge of any undertaking mentioned in the Scheduled to the Emergency Powers (Disasters) (Essential Occupations) Order, 19 may call on an employee in the service of that undertaking to perform and execute any additional work or duty that, in the opinion of the owner, manager or person is necessary or expedient for securing the maintenance of supplies or essential services. |

Offences.

6. Every public officer, public employee, employee in the service of a Statutory Board or employee of any undertaking referred to in paragraph 5 who, without lawful excuse, fails or refuses to perform or execute any work or duty he is called upon to do in pursuance of this order is guilty of an offence and is liable on summary conviction to a fine of one hundred dollars or to imprisonment for a term of three months or to both.
